A Cult Statue of Aphrodite from Gerasa (Jerash)

## **ABSTRACT**

In 2016 and 2017, several fragments of a Roman marble statue of Aphrodite were discovered in the East Baths of ancient Gerasa (modern-day Jerash in Jordan) by a Franco-German excavation team directed by Thomas Lepaon and Thomas Weber-Karyotakis. The over life-size statue was restored in 2018 by Franco Sciorilli and is today on display at the Visitor Center of the archaeological site. A Greek inscription on the plinth not only states that the statue was dedicated by the priest Demetrios together with a base, a niche, an altar and a hearth, but also provides a precise date for the dedication. In addition to examining the possibility that the statue was a cult image of Aphrodite, the talk will discuss the significance of the new find for the understanding of the cult of Aphrodite in the cities of the Syrian Decapolis.
